Components

19 wooden discs 6 wooden pawns (3 each in black and red)



Goal of the game

Each player aims to be the first to place their three colored pawns on neighbouring discs.

Setup

The 19 discs are arranged alongside each other in a hexagon shape. The black and red pawns are placed alternately on the 6 corner fields. Each player chooses a color. The first player is picked randomly, after which players take turns.




How to play

1. Moving a pawn: The player moves one of their pawns in a straight line up to the edge of the game field, or until it encounters another pawn.


Red has three different options for the first move.

In a later game scenario, there are four different options the red pawn can take.




2. Relocating a disc: After moving the pawn, the player takes away one free disc (with no pawn on it) from the edge of the field and relocates it to another position. The following rules should now be observed:

You are only allowed to take away those discs that can be slid out of position without moving other discs in the process.




Important: During the next turn the other player is not allowed to move the disc that the opponent has just relocated.

When repositioning the disc, it must touch at least two other discs.



However, you are allowed to remove discs, resulting in other discs only touching on one side.



End of the game

The winner of the match is the first player who succeeds in placing all three of their own pawns on neighbouring discs. The pawns can either be connected in a straight line, a triangular shape or like a tick.
